



Barton St David Scout Group

After a successful 2022-23 year we are looking forward to the summer. Whatever the weather we have an action-packed term ahead of us. **The Explorer unit** (14-18 years old) has much planned, starting with the famous *London Monopoly Run* where the actual game is played over real locations. Our first year at this challenge was last year and this year we aim to do even better. Cat, our leader, actually came on the Leader Board at her first attempt last year.

Scouts (10-14 years) have an activity camp planned in the summer which is always amazing, it offers one activity after another for two complete days. Caving, kayaking, dragon boating, abseiling, climbing and more, all while making friends with other Scouts across Somerset. Extraordinary value too compared to those adventure centres (although we do have two leaders who lead activities at the famous one near Longleat!). Scout weekly activities are amazing and varied too. Never a dull moment

Cubs will be attending a camp in addition to their weekly activities which have recently included kayaking, caving, first aid, hikes, escape room, entertainer badge and more. Our Leaders are never short of devising exciting activities for our 8-10.5 year olds

Beavers are our foundation and we love them as they have so much enthusiasm and try so much. Last term they had a visit from the RSPCA, learnt about the Chinese New Year and Fair Trade, learnt practical skills including knots, phonetic alphabet, pancake making and air activities and also conducted a space mission! Some local groups are starting *Squirrels for 4-6 year olds* so if there is anyone out there that feels like they'd consider spending some time volunteering with this age group, please let us know.

Are you wondering whether your child could join the fun? Perhaps you would like them to develop leadership skills by leading small teams when carrying out scenario based challenges. Or learn how to be a cooperative team member when doing problem solving activities? What about the more intangible benefits of growing in confidence, learning to win or lose with grace, pushing back personal comfort zones or simply understand what 'doing your best' means? The Scouting Programme ensures that they start learning these skills at 6 years old and build on the same skills again and again as they progress through the sections. We call it building 'skills for life'. We also bring youngsters from local communities together. They may go to different schools but we help them to mix with others and, as they grow older, to mix with Scouts from other groups in Somerset and beyond. We have Explorers going to Kenya this year with other Somerset Scouts.

Our sessions are done at the extraordinary value of less than £3 per session. That barely pays the cost of the insurance and hall hire but we feel strongly that no one in our community should feel excluded from accessing the benefits of Scouting. We have had a huge fundraising effort in the past year so that we can buy all the tents and camping equipment that our children deserve without asking parents to pay more. We are proud of that monetary value compared to other youth activities in nearby towns but what makes us truly proud is helping the young people in our local community do their best. That's priceless.

Some sections are full with a waiting list (which moves fairly quickly as children move up to the next section). Others have some capacity and we can take someone very quickly. There is also a growing waiting list for under 6's to ensure their place once they become 6 years old. Contact Vega Sturgess, Group Scout Leader on <code>gslbarton@yahoo.com</code>. 



Diamond Jubilee Wood

Our lovely Diamond Jubilee Wood was planted nearly 10 years ago (Nov 2013) with 800 native trees and shrubs provided by the Woodland Trust; it is now flourishing. It was decided earlier in the year to 'upgrade' the top hedge which was mainly bramble and 80 metres of native hedge has now been planted with spiral guards and mulched to suppress weed growth.

We had an expert from Reimagining the Levels (Somerset Tree planting Group) to have a look and make suggestions. He suggested in order to encourage more biodiversity in the main body of woodland, we needed to plant a range of different native shrubs. Hitherto, the shrubs were limited to hawthorn, hazel, dogwood and dog-rose. Eighty shrubs have now been planted either side of the main tree plantings and these are a selection of spindle, wayfaring, alder buckthorn, common buckthorn, guelder rose, honeysuckle, holly and elder.

With the recent rains, we are hoping these will establish well and encourage the biodiversity that the countryside desperately needs. A big 'thank you' must go to the Reimagining the Levels team and a group of volunteers from the village who planted the shrubs earlier in March. Want Barton to Have Real Legal Weight In Planning Applications? Then We Need a Neighbourhood Plan

Currently, the Parish Council is consulted on planning applications – we are asked for our views. But these are seen as views only – not decisions – and our views can be ignored by the Planning Authorities and property developers. The "rules" are set by the Government at national level and the District Council at the South Somerset level.

But a **Neighbourhood Plan** would give Barton St David **statutory powers to shape how our community develops** – giving us a greater say. It is a statutory document which means that it <u>has</u> to be taken into account by property developers and the local authority planning officers – it carries **real, legal weight.** The Plan would set out our planning policies for Barton:

- Protecting and enhancing what we've got.
- Protecting the village facilities and areas of land that we value most such as the Village Hall, the playing fields and our green spaces.
- Protecting areas of land for conservation, biodiversity and landscape value.
- Propose transport solutions and regeneration projects.
- Identify areas for housing/employment.
- Influence the type, location and design of development.
- Help to secure funding for infrastructure and other projects.

The **Neighbourhood Plan** has to align with and be consistent with national and county planning policies – but in effect it fills in the gaps of these policies as we would wish them to be filled. The **Neighbourhood Plan** would be **written by the village** for the village. It is NOT a Parish Council plan but **Our Community Plan**.

There are 3 stages:

- *Stage 1:* forming a steering group and creating the plan to develop our Neighbourhood Plan.
- *Stage 2:* develop the Plan identify our issues, consulting the whole village, drafting our policies.
- *Stage 3:* independent assessment of our Plan, a village-wide referendum and then the Plan is adopted.

Expert help, guidance, advice and funding is available to help us. It would take about 2 years from start to finish. So: would you like to get involved and be part of a team to develop our Neighbourhood Plan? Do you have a particular interest area? Or just want to find out more? Things were looking grim. Possibly Grim with a capital 'G'. The doom and gloom brigade were out in force suggesting that such a perfect storm of negative events would have to result in a minimal or even

negative (?) turnout. Perhaps only the tempting prospect of a few free biscuits, thereby ruling out the need to cook an evening meal, would entice anyone to even try to get to Brimsmore by 18.00hrs. The garden centre would resemble the 'Mary Celeste' as lonely staff, looking forward to overtime and considerate customers, desperately searched the aisles looking for someone, indeed anyone, to come and take advantage of the discount that was on offer in the store. Would the coffee go cold in the cups? Would the biscuits, only commercial digestives admittedly, but still just about biscuits, be left for the grateful mice as they enjoyed their nocturnal free-run of this busy emporium? The prospect for the evening was not positive.

The weather was worse than unseasonable. Strong winds had caused havoc in Lydford and the surrounding villages. Green bins had developed the power of independent movement. Black boxes were strewn across the roads like so many over-sized rodent traps and daffodils, especially the fancy 'doubles', were lying prostate, appearing as so many Glastonbury revellers after a hard night on the cider. Then there was the rain! It was no surprise that there had been a run on the B & Q's 'Build your own Ark' kits and farmers had been espied planting rice rather than corn. If frost does threaten use fleece, cloches, cardboard or even newspaper to lay over and protect the outdoor plants. If the month is dry (not like March!) keep on top of watering seeds and seedlings. Weed as if your life depends upon it! Hoe on dry days but make sure you are attacking weeds not newly emerging and valued seedlings. Earth-up potatoes and stake and support peas and beans. Enjoy the first al-fresco evening cocktail of the year!

Recently, I have received reports of telephone scams regarding bank accounts. The information below is a shortened version information published by Which? late last year. *'Calls and texts from your bank.*

Don't be fooled by calls and text messages claiming to be from your bank or credit card company. In some cases they spoof the caller ID, so that it appears to match the bank's genuine telephone number. Others make 'robocalls' that deliver pre-recorded messages inviting you to press a number on the keypad to speak to them about a spurious problem, such as a suspicious payment on your account. Scammers will often have some personal details about you already, to make them even more convincing. Also, fake bank texts that try to get you to follow link to a fake website or phone a fake helpline that puts you straight though to the fraudsters.

The end game is to convince you to hand over sensitive data, move money to a supposedly 'safe account' that the fraudster controls or gain access to your device using remote access or screen sharing software.

• Stay safe – ignore any links included in texts and never trust Caller ID. If you have any doubts about the authenticity of a message, contact your bank or card issuer using a trusted method such as their mobile app or official telephone number on your bank statement or on the back of your card.'

Criminals are experts at impersonating people, organisations and the police. They spend hours researching you for their scams, hoping you'll let your guard down for just a moment. Stop and think. It could protect you and your money!

In the region of 40% of all reported crime is cyber crime – there's a lot of it about! If you think you may have been a victim of a scam contact your bank immediately and report it online to Action Fraud

Lydford Forest Gardens Celebrates 25 years

I find it hard to believe that it is 25 years since Lydford Forest Garden was first planted. For those new to the area you may have visited the forest garden, across the churchyard footbridge in West Lydford.

On 16/05/97, villagers met in the Parish Hall to discuss ways to mark the new Millennium. Many ideas were raised but a local villager suggested *a community garden – a forest garden*, the idea took off.

A committee was formed; land donated; grants awarded then the first trees were planted in November 1998, by villagers, some of whom are still here today. The legal stuff took longer. A charity had to be set up, the land had to be surveyed and then transferred. Even setting up a bank account was no mean achievement.

Over the years the forest garden has become a beautiful productive place, visited and enjoyed by lots of people including children and families to picnic or pick fruit or just to enjoy a bit of peace and quiet. In some cases, visitors from other villages have been inspired to set up their own community forest gardens.

'Friends of Lydford Forest Gardens' have taken a particular interest in this charity. This is a small group of people and they help financially. Money is needed for our public liability insurance, for running the website, for replacing fencing and for making any other improvements. A subset of this group provides practical help to cut grass several times each season, to weed the fruit bushes and prune the trees and to maintain the benches plus carry out larger jobs such as hedge laying and fencing.

Many of the original **'Friends of Lydford Forest Gardens'** have moved on to pastures new and this very special charity needs new **'Friends'** and also Trustees to ensure this lovely forest garden continues to thrive into the future.

Many gardens have charitable status such as quiet gardens; memorial gardens, commemorative gardens, gardens part of huge organizations such as the National Trust or the Royal Horticultural Society, but our forest garden is unique. It is the only place in the country with Trust status that is a forest garden, totally independent, organic, free and with unlimited access.

Remember Jesus too

Writing about the celebration of Holy Communion almost eighty years ago, Gregory Dix posed the question 'Was ever another command so obeyed?' It's well worth searching online for his whole answer. An edited quote of his response reads:

'For century after century, spreading slowly to every continent and country and among every race on earth, this action has been done, in every conceivable human circumstance, for every conceivable human need. Men have found no better thing than this to do for kings at their crowning and for criminals going to the scaffold; for armies in triumph or for a bride and bridegroom in a little country church; for the wisdom of the Parliament of a mighty nation or for a sick old woman afraid to die; while the lions roared in the nearby amphitheatre; on the beach at Dunkirk. And best of all, week by week and month by month, on a hundred thousand successive Sundays, faithfully, unfailingly, across all the parishes of Christendom, the pastors have done this just to make the plebs sancta Dei—the holy common people of God.'

The first of Dix's scenarios will be played out before us at the coronation of King Charles III. At the heart of the ceremony, amidst all the pomp and circumstance, the oaths and declarations, the regalia and crowning, will be the celebration of Holy Communion. The words used will be just the same as those spoken in our parish churches Sunday by Sunday. From Communion, the King and Queen will be sent out from Westminster Abbey to live like us the prayer we say at the end of many of our services. They will offer 'their souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice, sent out in the power of [God's] Spirit to live and work to [God's] praise and glory.'

The command that the King, Queen and all of us obey is Jesus's direction to 'Do this in remembrance of me.' So, as you watch the Coronation please remember Jesus too. For he is the one who comes to us as a servant; the king of Kings.



The £2 Bus Fare Extended Until The End Of June

The Somerset Bus Partnership has welcomed the Government's decision to provide an additional £75 million. This will enable bus operators to continue to cap their

single adult bus fares at £2. The £2 flat fare introduced in January is now set to continue through to the end of June. Bus users in Somerset will be able to continue to travel on most bus routes in the county and beyond for just £2.

It's worth remembering that this initiative applies to crossboundary services, which means you can travel for example from Yeovil to Taunton or Chard to Taunton for just £2. It's hoped this will persuade even more people to travel by bus, whether that's for work, education, shopping or medical treatments. Millions of people across England will be saving



money just at a time when many households are suffering from the rising cost of living.

The 13 operators involved in the scheme are: ATWEST, Bakers Dolphin, Community Transport (South West) Ltd, Dartline, Faresaver Buses, First South West (Buses of Somerset), First West of England, Hatch Green Coaches, FromeBus, Libra Travel, Mendip Community Transport, Somerset County Council and South West Coaches. Somerset County Council and the Somerset Bus Partnership have launched the 'BUS IT' campaign to promote bus travel. Somerset Bus Partnership's Co-Chair, Peter Travis, said, "Bus usage had declined in Somerset during the previous decade, and even more so during the pandemic. So initiatives like the £2 flat fare are needed to boost passenger levels. Encouraging people to choose buses over cars is really important because it also helps reduce our carbon emissions. Transport accounts for nearly half of our carbon emissions in Somerset. Somerset Bus Partnership will therefore be continuing to work with Somerset County Council to encourage greater bus usage."

Help Needed - Somerset Bus Partnership is a voluntary organisation formed some 2 years ago. It now has 150 bus champions and works with 125 Parish Councils across Somerset. It ensures the views of bus users are heard on what they need from bus services in our County ... which means people can get to where they want to ... when they want to ... and the journey is reliable, comfortable and affordable. Key to the journey experience is easy access to bus information, improved bus stops and bus stations, and bus services that integrate with rail.

We are looking to expand the work of Somerset Bus Partnership over the next 12 months. However, we need more resource to help us do this. Can you spare an hour a month to help? We could do with some assistance with our membership and administration. Or do you have a background in Planning, Traffic Management or Public Transport? Or have fundraising experience and could help with submitting fundraising plans?
