But why?

There are any number of reasons but one that resonates for me is the responsibility we're given in Scripture to look after the world, sea, animals, birds, plants. We're called to tend it, to use it well and to look after it. Then Jesus used the beauty of the creation around us as a way of challenging us to trust God to take care of us, because He feeds birds and gives flowers their beauty.

Unfortunately, as we're all too well aware birds are not receiving their food and flowers are disappearing in part because we are not fulfilling our role in caring for the environment and world around us.

There are groups to help us change this, Arocha has worked with the environment on environmental concerns for many years and locally Somerset Wildlife Trust helps us respond to our context. Maybe you could look up the website of a group you know about and see if you can take part in some way or

I hope that you have a good summer, and that you're able to enjoy the amazing world around us, and maybe help us to take care of it, as together we tend the earth and look after it.





Lydford and District Gardening Club



Structure is a wonderful thing. David Usher spoke to the Gardening Club in May about soil structure and how important a good arrangement of particles is, if one is looking to grow prize-winning

geraniums or other splendiferous crops. Mr. Usher was, by all accounts, a very nice man who possessed that most important of character traits, a sense of humour. He also appeared distinctly well-organised and his slides were full of useful information and very easy to understand. The title of his talk was *'The answer lies in the soil'* and whilst those of a ghoulish nature might have expected some dark references to an Agatha Christie mystery in which a corpse ends up at the bottom of a runner bean trench, no such suggestions were made and a wholesome lecture was based on humus, not humous, clay, silt, loam and sand in order of particle size and the three vital gardening letters N, P and K.

These initials refer to the three main constituents of fertiliser - Nitrogen, Phosphate and Potash. The clever amongst you will realise that Potash does not begin with K. The even cleverer will appreciate that K is the atomic symbol for Potassium, derived from the Neo-Latin word Kalium which is based on the fact that this element is a very strong alkali, I think. O level chemistry was a long time ago, almost before this metal was first isolated by Humphry Davy in 1807 so please do not base any quiz answers on the information contained within! The relative amounts of N, P and K in any horticultural product are always expressed as a ratio. For instance, human urine, when used as a fertiliser, is said to be active in the ratio 11:1:2 - heavy on Nitrogen. Does this vary depending on food and liquid intake and what would the effect be of a few pints of honest scrumpy?

Earthworms also had a few starring moments! Apparently there are 27 species in the U.K although there were some scary stories a few years ago about an aggressive beast from New Zealand which was supposed to be eating all our cuddly little ones. Thankfully, the North Auckland worm, occasionally over a metre in length, does not appear to have proliferated over here. Herewith a fact to save for when the conversation dips at the next dinner party - in a well wormed soil these glorious creatures can move over 40 tons of soil per acre per day! Impressive shifting.

Consequently her appearance is one not to be missed and it will be interesting to see if earthworms have pride of place in her discourse. It is doubtful if human urine will feature again but one can live in hope!

Percy Thrower

Percy Thrower died 35 years ago. He was one of the first, if not the first, television celebrity gardener and Messers Don and Titchmarsh owe a lot to this colossus of the Shrewsbury Parks Department.

Percy presented many episodes of 'Gardeners' World' until the BBC found him 'guilty' of doing some advertisements for horticultural products on ITV and was also involved with the Blue Peter garden until only days before his death.

He is also credited with producing many books and the following tips for June are taken from 'In your garden with Percy Thrower' first published in 1959. After 64 years will his suggestions still make sense or even still be legal?

Water bedding plants, plant marrows, stake herbaceous plants, sow turnips. Spray just about everything including roses, raspberries and cherries with Derris, lime sulphur, malathion and systemic insecticide. (Probably not now legal, certainly not desirable!). Cut grass edges, trim alpines, lift tulips, stop and top-dress cucumbers and broad beans, plant leeks and cabbages.

The full list is practically endless. Unfortunately there is no mention of sitting and enjoying a cool beer but I am sure he would not mind if this was included at the very end of a tiring day spent protecting cauliflower curds and fumigating against whitefly!

Many modern garages are used for additional storage rather than housing a car. Ensure good quality padlocks are used to provide additional security.

Ground anchors are a good way of securing motorbikes or bicycles as these remain popular targets for thieves. Adding your garage to any existing burglar alarm system or using a standalone alarm can give an audible deterrent.

'Your Majesty, as children of the kingdom of God we welcome you in the name of the King of kings'. In reply to these opening words at his Coronation, King Charles III responded 'In his name and after his example I come not to be served but to serve.' This short exchange summed up what the service was about and what it intended to convey.

The King's commitment to service is not in any doubt. To give just a few examples, he has engaged with our most challenged communities far more than any politician, he called on us to care for the environment years before it became popular to do so and, of course, founded The Prince's Trust, which supports our most challenged younger people in so many ways.

He becomes king of a new era, the Carolean era. Our times see us face some big challenges. Our question is how to address them. I was immensely struck by all the agencies and charities present in the Abbey for the King's Coronation. Their participation spoke of the ways in which we're going to need to act differently in the years ahead to address the issues that confront us.

Because it's all too evident that the power of government, be that local or national, to respond to the problems we see is less now than it was when the late Queen began her reign. Our challenge in this era is of how we're going to come together, in service, to address the different challenges that lie before us, be that the climate, how we tackle poverty, how we respond to a troubled international situation. All of us will have a part to play.

Where to find the resource to act in the way that's going to be needed? As I stood beside the King at the Coronation what inspired me was to see the way he drew so much strength, purpose and resolve and assurance from his Christian faith for the service he's called to give. And in that we can follow him too.


