

And I'm sure you will have your own family stories and memories of what has happened this year.

When it feels as if the world is quite fragile, in both climatic and political terms, we can feel overwhelmed. At times maybe we want to turn the news off, stop scrolling on our phones or listen to something else on the radio, and that is probably quite a sensible reaction. In our instant news world there can be just *'too much information'* and our brains just don't know where to turn (or at least that can be true of mine!)

So when this happens how can we respond? Sometimes we need to stop, turn off our phones, TV or tablets and breathe. We can start by listening to the sounds around us, taking in the noise of our homes, maybe we can hear what is happening outside. Then we can start to listen to the sounds within us, for some of us that will mean trying to get beyond the tinnitus, there may be swooshes and glugs, but we can pause to listen.

Then maybe we're ready to listen to our hearts, to hear what our bodies are saying to us, and to hear what God is saying.

Many years ago, the prophet Elijah encountered God on a mountain. To his surprise it was not in the noise, the wind, the earthquake or the fire but it was the sound of sheer silence. In the Psalms we're invited to:

'Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth. The Lord of hosts is with us; The God of Jacob is our refuge.' Psalm 46:10-11

So whatever we face this autumn, in our lives or in the life of the world around us, maybe we can take time to stop, to wonder and to pause, listening to ourselves, our community and maybe our God.

Lydford and District Gardening Club

I According to Percy, August is a month when it is important to take the lower leaves from tomatoes. Obviously a bit of judicious spraying is vital and cinerarias will benefit from copious quantities of malathion, whatever that is! Early apples should be picked if any are

still to be found on the trees following June, July and August drop. Lavender should be trimmed, ensuring that the cuts are not so severe as to go into old wood.
