Christmas is really for the children

Christmas is really for the children. Especially for children who like animals, stables, stars and babies wrapped in swaddling clothes. Then there are wise men, kings in fine robes, humble shepherds and a hint of rich perfume.

Easter is not really for the children unless accompanied by a cream filled egg. It has whips, blood, nails, a spear and allegations of body snatching. It involves politics, God and the sins of the world. It is not good for people of a nervous disposition. They would do better to think on rabbits, chickens and the first snowdrop of spring.

Or they'd do better to wait for a re-run of Christmas without asking too many questions about what Jesus did when he grew up or whether there's any connection.

Dear friends

I'm writing this in mid November, after Remembrance Day, Christmas advertisements and music are just beginning. The Post Office has begun to sell Christmas stamps, silhouetteimages of different parts of the nativity account.

Very simple and yet going to the heart of Christmas, the remembrance that Christ was born, as 'God with us' so that we might be able to know the life that He offers and His presence with us day after day.

At this time of year I find myself reflecting on Steve Turner's poem, produced alongside this letter, and once again considering the place of Children and Adults at Christmas but also in the life of the church and Christian story.

New babies are intrinsically vulnerable, in need of comfort, being held and watched out for. Maybe that is why we associate Christmas and children, along with the excitement in a child's eyes on Christmas morning, their joy and the almost explosion of fun that can emerge from them.

Babies grow up, sometimes they present families and parents with challenges greater than expected, and sometimes things do not go to plan. At that point it may be difficult to remember the joy felt when they were children.

Jesus also grew up, He lived life and changed lives forever, and still does. The story continues from Christmas, to Easter and beyond. As churches and parishes we continue to find new ways to tell the story of Jesus, and of the life of the church. We want to help children and adults not just to see Christmas with wide eves and excitement, but also to Steve Turner Nice and Nasty 1980 ! know that God came as a baby at Christmas that we might know Him with us every day.







Be Prepared



As I'm writing this, we are on the edge of Storm Debi the fourth named storm of the year – so far we have generally got off lightly but I thought it would be useful to put some information together to help readers of the magazine in case of power cuts.

If there is a power cut due obviously to severe weather conditions here are some helpful tips -

- It doesn't matter who you buy your electricity from anyone can call 105 for free and you will be connected to your local network operator for up to date information.
- Leave a light switched on so you know when the power returns.
- Limit the use of your smart phone, tablet or laptop to save the battery power.
- Avoid opening your freezer door.
- Turn off and unplug any sensitive equipment such as TV's and computers.
- Unplug appliances that get hot you may forget they are on when the power returns.
- Keep battery/wind up torches at the ready.
- Many modern telephones won't work during a power cut so use an analogue phone that can be plugged into a telephone socket.
- Protect sensitive electrical equipment with a surge protector plug.
- Make sure you have a charged battery charger handy so you can recharge your smart phone or tablet.
- Check on elderly and vulnerable neighbours.
- When power cuts are threatened fill a flask with hot water so you can make a drink or fill a hot water bottle.

Michael Beasley, Bishop of Bath and Wells A unique story





When I speak to my Mum on my birthday, she often recalls to me the events that surrounded my arrival in the world. These include nearly being born in the hospital lift, my older brother being smuggled in to see me under my dad's overcoat and of various aunts sneaking onto the maternity ward out of visiting hours by

wearing their WRVS uniforms.

Each of us has a unique story about our birth. At Christmas we'll be recounting once again the story that we share about another birth - the birth of *Jesus.* Across the world we'll be re-telling and re-enacting what happened in Bethlehem more than 2000 years ago. We'll recall the journey of Mary and Joseph, the birth in the stable, the arrival of the shepherds, the song of the angels, the visit of the Magi.

Our own birth stories are unique to each of us. Jesus's is common to us all. And not just because we all know about it. For in our recollection of Jesus' birth, we'll also be remembering that that in him, God came to be at one with us. In Jesus God arrived to share fully in our humanity, experiencing complete solidarity with every aspect of our human condition. Just as much as he is with us in our greatest joys and our deepest woes, Jesus is also for us. One of the earliest teachers of the Church said this: 'He became what we are so that we might become what he is.'

The baby born in Bethlehem stands with us not only in all that we experience. This child also comes to offer us the possibility of opening every part of our lives to the transforming power of God's life of love and joy and peace. He comes so that every day we can become a little more like him. This is the good news of Christmas and may it be yours this year.


