

Grants made by Parish Council in 2023-24

The parish council enjoys providing grants to local organisations and to date this year have gone slightly over the budget allocation and given out grants totalling £7924.

Precept request by Parish Council 2024-25

In January the parish council set their budget and agree what requests to make in terms of the funding they require for the next financial year which impacts council tax paid by local residents.

This will be challenging this year as Somerset Council are asking parish councils to take on some of their functions e.g. drain and gully clearance, rubbish removal from bins etc. The parish council will be working through some difficult decisions.

The first draft of parts of the report have been released and will soon be available for public release. The findings will be useful when reviewing planning applications.

An Advocate is an independent person who can offer one-to-one support to children and young people to have their voice heard when meetings are taking place concerning their wellbeing. It's the role of the Advocate to speak up for the young person, make them aware of their rights, listen to them and represent their views, wishes and feelings.

If this is a taste of the future then rice might need to be the crop of choice and the water buffalo farm on the way to Yeovil will have a ready market However, a few years ago it was suggested that for any spare beasts. Mediterranean gardening might have to be the way forward. Letter from Matthew Reed, Mendip Neighbourhood Policing Inspector

I am delighted to have been invited to write an article for the Parish Newsletter. As the Neighbourhood Policing Inspector, I am in charge of delivering Neighbourhood Policing services to the whole Mendip area. I am supported by four very capable supervisors and an experienced team of PC's and PCSO's.

Our main roles include providing a visible, reassuring presence and engaging with our communities and to work with partners to solve problems that cause harm. We also respond to and investigate criminal incidents, such as assaults, thefts and burglaries.

I am pleased to say that Lydford and the surrounding villages are safe places to live and work. They enjoy a low crime rate when compared to other areas. This is not to say we are complacent because sadly, incidents requiring our attention do still occur. In speaking to members of the local community, I feel that the perception of crime is different to the reality of what is reported to us. People often feel like they don't want to report minor matters to the police, in fear of wasting our time. Unfortunately, what we don't know about, we can't deal with! Underreporting of crime and antisocial behaviour is a common problem.

So, I would like to take this opportunity to encourage members of the community to report all incidents which they feel may be linked to criminality or anti-social behaviour. You will never be criticised for making a call with good intent if when checked, the circumstances turn out to be innocent. We would prefer to check than risk missing something!

If a crime is in progress, or there is an immediate risk to life & limb or damage to property, please call 999. This may include suspicious incidents where you think drugs are being dealt or suspicious people are knocking door-to-door.

If a crime or incident has happened, but does not require an immediate police response, please either call 101 or report it online at:

www.avonand somerset.police.uk/report.

The latter is very effective and will stop you having to wait on hold, which unfortunately happens sometimes. Information about crime can also be reported via Crimestoppers which is an anonymous service, separate to the police: <code>www.crimestoppers-uk.org</code>. The Parish also has a strong Neighbourhood Watch scheme in operation – please contact my team if you would like more information.

My team hold regular beat surgeries which members of the public can attend to ask for advice or report issues of concern. Our social media pages and website have details of when and where these are held:

I'd love to be writing a sunny New Year's article reflecting a boundless global optimism about the future. Yet the reality is very different. War in Ukraine drags on and tensions in the Middle East remain dangerous. The cost-of-living crisis continues and many are finding things tough. Pessimism rather than optimism is the order of our day.

In such circumstances, where can hope be found? For Christians, confidence and assurance rest in the promise of the future that God has in store for us. In the Bible God says: 'See, I am making all things new. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end' (Revelation 21: 5-6). Christian hope is that whatever may be happening to us now, God has a very different and favourable future in store for us.

Critically, the point of such hope is not just to enable us to say 'Well don't worry about present circumstances. It's all going to be all right eventually.' Hope's purpose is to shape how we live and what we do now. It's to enable us to live out the words of the old Christian Aid poster that said, 'We believe in life before death'.

So, as we start a new year, please can I encourage us all not to stare into our glasses, lamenting their being half full? Rather, through how we live and what we do, let us fill them with the new wine of God's kingdom - overflowing to the brim. For that is hope in deed.

News in brief

The Souls of our Shoes

An exhibition by the Mothers' Union has been on display in Wells Cathedral, and at November's Diocesan Synod, to draw attention to the issue of domestic violence. It features shoes of all different styles, sizes, and colours along with a comment from those who have walked away from abuse and those who have journeyed with them.

Created by the Mothers' Union in Scotland, it is an extension of the Union's initiatives to highlight abuse, and the practical and prayerful support that is offered to families. It is hoped it can

"provide a reminder that with timely help, many can escape from their abusive situations, rebuild their confidence and live in safety."

Sustainable flowers

Research suggests that traditional floral foam, also known as oasis, is nonrecyclable and contains the same amount of plastic as 10 plastic shopping bags.

"Angie shared lots of hints and tips... I for one certainly came away more confident in moving away from using floral foam and have taken another step toward an eco-friendlier ministry in flowers."





Plotgate enjoys the enthusiastic support of a growing membership. To build on this, we have arranged -

We cordially invite you to attend to discuss and explore the future of Barton's Community Farm including its access from Mill Road. We are delighted that Sarah Dyke MP has agreed to be with us for the occasion.

Our acquisition of an additional 16 acres of land to the North of the existing farm promises to enable an exciting increase in diversification. In outline, these planned developments include -


Much needed water remediation in response to flooding and sewage releases at Tootle Bridge. We also plan to restore the ancient water meadow – now one of the rarest of land types and habitats - and contribute to the reversal of wildlife decline by recreating the conditions in which a rich ecosystem can flourish.

We are in discussion with Wessex Water, the Brue Drainage Board and the Farming Resilience Team and are carrying out weekly sampling and testing of water across our land. Early results consistently show excessive levels of phosphates and nitrates in water courses on the new land (particularly at the sites of the sewage outlet and the rhyne it discharges into) compared to negligible levels in the water that has gone through the Plotgate filtering system.

We looking forward to welcoming you at the open meeting to share and consider the next steps together.


Plotgate Community Farm is co-operatively run by its members. The growers and volunteers produce seasonal vegetables on a 16-acre site in Barton St David. Members can collect, or have delivered, a weekly or fortnightly

share of the produce, each box containing at least 8 different types of vegetable. There are events, activities and opportunities as well as fresh food all
