Dear all

I'm writing this just over half-way through January, and the magazine takes us to the end of March, which this year includes Easter Day, a bit like the shops selling Easter Eggs and Hot Cross Buns as soon as Christmas Day has happened, I'm trying to look forward!

This year Ash Wednesday is on 14th February so Lent begins on Valentine's Day. At first this may feel a bit incongruous, after all one of the known approached to Lent is to give up chocolate, whilst Valentine's Day is a day to give and receive chocolate!

We know practically nothing about the original Valentine, who may in fact have been two people martyred in the third Century for their faith. The origins of Valentines Day have little to do with Valentine himself and go back to John Donne who wrote a poem for Princess Elizabeth the daughter of James 1 who married on Valentines day in 1632, and this poem merged with the commemoration of Valentine and fertility symbolism arising from the spring mating rituals of birds!

But beginning Lent on Valentine's Day it is not as incongruous as it feels. The reason we may choose to give something up in Lent or to take up a new discipline or experience is so that we may grow in our love and commitment to God. So maybe beginning Lent, a time of reflection and preparation for Easter and remembering someone who was martyred for their faith is a good combination.

As our Lent course this year, we're going to use the *Archbishop of Canterbury's Difference course*. It is an opportunity for people of all faiths and none to think about how we live with those who think and believe differently from us. We will have a Christian basis, but all are welcome. We meet for 5 weeks on Wednesday evenings starting on 21^{st} February in The Rectory. All are welcome.

Observing Lent then prepares us to celebrate at Easter. To remember and recall Jesus' death and then celebrate his resurrection on Easter Day. Details of our services for Easter are in the magazine and you're welcome to join us.

We look forward to welcoming you at some point in the next few months

The next Parish Council Meeting will take place on Tuesday 6th February and Tuesday 5th March 2024 at 7:30pm in the village hall. Public session will take place at 7:30pm immediately before the formal meeting. All are welcome to attend.

Precept request by parish council 2024-25

In January the parish council set their budget and confirmed that their precept request (request from the government) would be in the sum of £20 804 (£20 280 in 2023).

This will result in a 6.5% increase per annum for Band D properties which will be £43.80 (£41.13 in 2023). The council have had to really consider carefully the amount requested due to the financial concerns expressed by Somerset Council on their ability to continue to provide non-statutory services. Parish councils may have to pick up the cost of some services e.g. having bins emptied.

Traffic Report

The report commissioned by the parish council was drafted by the consultant and then a further request was made to look closely at pinch points in the village and this has now been completed. A verbal response from the consultant recommends that no further pressure is put onto Queen Street in terms of traffic. The draft report should be with the parish council by the end of January.



Thankfully, when it came to trying out CPR and using a defibrillator, we were able to use dummies! Many of us were surprised just how easy it is to use a defibrillator as it actually tells you exactly what to do.

Early feedback on the course from participants has been very positive with many feeling much more confident should they witness somebody experiencing a cardiac arrest. To maintain this level of confidence we plan to run more courses in future. The team was also strongly encouraged to continue with its work to acquire defibrillators for Lydford-on-Fosse, and hopefully to establish a local team of Community First Responders.

Living the story. Telling the story

As Christians, while we may look to reduce our own carbon footprint, we are called to be stewards and witnesses of a much more radical resource. The clue is in the word *'ecology'*.

'Eco' comes from the Greek word oikos, meaning house, or dwelling place. Ecology is partly about our responsibility to recognise the precious gift of the Earth, as our dwelling place:

to be thankful, and play our part. God made humankind to care for the earthly world: Jesus amplifies the call, as He uses *'nature'* as the sign of how we can live in order to flourish and to fulfil God's will.

'*Logy*' comes from a Greek word logos interpreted as reason, the ordering of knowledge, logic. In John's Gospel, logos is a word to describe Jesus – through whom all things are made and from whom all true knowledge comes. Logos is the word, the source of all goodness and grace, for every human life, and for all of creation.

It is the *'logos'*, the word, who inhabits our lives, our creation – inviting us to recognise His light, and allow it to overcome the darkness of our own limited concerns and agendas. We meet the logos in scripture, in worship, in prayer, and deeper reflection.

In Jesus, as logos, we can find the wisdom, the resources and the commitment to play our part in caring for creation. We are able to invite others to recognise the deeper truths about Eco, our common dwelling place, and to see more clearly how we join with others to work out what to do, how to live, and honour the gift of life that we receive through Him. The Logos is the possibility of good news for humankind and for the Earth.

What a responsibility each Christian disciple is called to bear! And what grace can be ours to enable us to fulfil our calling, and help all of God's children become caught up in the praise and prayer that gives true life to our dwelling place, and to exercise our stewardship appropriately.

Read John 1v1-14. Become an ECO-warrior – committed to our common dwelling place – through celebrating the power and presence of the LOGOS.

ECOLOGY: we know it makes sense.


