Dear all

April is a month that holds all sorts of change and opportunity within it --

- The days are truly lengthening and getting warmer, maybe the mud will begin to dry out soon!
- Plants in gardens and fields are beginning to put on spurts of growth and produce crops.
- Children and young people are preparing for exams, entering their final term at a school or nursery
- Some of us are planning holidays, or visits from family over the summer.

Into all of those comes the season of Easter, which combines many of them:

- The word is associated with the pagan spring festival of rebirth.
- Easter in the church speaks of hope of life beyond the grave, and a risen Jesus who comes to be with His people.

The Easter narrative is one that includes: betrayal, denial, death, despair, and the end of hope and then a complete transformation as the women go to the tomb and find it empty, with the grave cloths neatly folded (which meant that they were no longer needed) and then there were encounters with the risen Jesus.

Easter is not a one-day event, we focus on it for 7 weeks, until mid-May this year. But in the church every Sunday is a celebration of the resurrection, that is why we meet on a Sunday.

I suspect that for many of us there are parts of life that we long would change, it may be a family situation, ongoing illness and treatment, bereavement, unemployment, future uncertainties, or almost anything else. The good news of Easter is that because Jesus rose from the dead, he comes to be with us, to accompany us in any and every situation. He doesn't require us to welcome him, but he offers to be there. The disciples were usually surprised when he arrived, they were not quite sure when he would come and they did not always recognise him.

So may we learn to recognise his presence and to trust him in any and every situation. If you'd like to know more then please do give me a call

Date for your Diary – Sunday, 5th May The Wheathill Benefice 4 - Church Walk



The popular 4-Church Walk is back, starting from St Peter's Church, Lydford at 10:45 on Sunday, 5th May and to which EVERYONE is warmly welcomed to join in. If you would like to walk the complete circuit taking in the 4 Churches, or a section of the walk to call in at any of the churches during the day, or just attend a short walkers' service in Lydford at 10:00am before the start, it will be lovely to see you. We suggest you bring a picnic lunch to eat in St Mary Magdalene, Keinton Mandeville.

Setting off from Lydford Church at 10:45am, the route heads west through orchards and across farmland to Barton St David. From there, it continues west up a farm track and across the fields to the Church of All Saints, Kingweston.

Walking south through Kingweston village, the route crosses the B3153 at the Lower Farm Grain Store and then picks up a green lane and well-marked footpaths to St Mary Magdalene, Keinton Mandeville where a stop for a picnic lunch could be taken. The last section follows an ancient track crossing over the B3153 once more, before a final downhill walk back to Lydford.

ANYONE wishing to join friends and members of the four parishes on any length of the walk will be warmly welcomed and we hope particularly that many families will join in. It will be a fun day, full of fellowship and fresh air. For those who complete the circle, the distance is about 8 miles [12km] of easy to moderate going although, *if it is or has been wet*, the ground could be very muddy in places.

Route cards will be available on the day and the route will be indicated by arrows at important junctions. There will be people walking who know the way across the fields and along the footpaths. Dogs on leads will be welcome with the usual request to observe dog-walking etiquette, the countryside code and to respect non-dog lovers! *Please note not all styles or gates are dog friendly*.

Limited cloakroom facilities will be available in all the churches. Donations welcome to Benefice funds.





Barton Bids a Fond Farewell to the Pre-School After forty six years of pre-school education in the Village Hall

How did it all start? With thanks to Janet Powell for her memories that take us back to the 1970's -

In 1973 when Juliet was nine months old, I started a Registered Playgroup at the Dove Centre in Butleigh. Initially this was to cater for the children of members of the Dove Community and students. I started the Playgroup with the support of a small number of local Mums who had young children of their own.

The original group outgrew the premises that the Dove Centre was able to provide so we obtained permission from the Village Hall Committee to move to Barton St David Village Hall. *This permission was only given after lively discussion.*

The Vicar, Reverend Thomas, was Chairman and he initially opposed the idea because he felt that it would be detrimental to the fabric of the hall. Richard Hicks and others spoke up vociferously in support of the Playgroup insisting that it would benefit the local children. It's important to remember that the Playgroup (later Pre-school) movement was in its infancy at the time.

The Pre-school started in the Village Hall on January 10th 1977 operating on five mornings a week. The hall had no facilities for Pre-school children. Space had to be made for the storage of a few pieces of equipment. Between us we carried quite a few items around in the boots of our cars! We used potties for small children and lifted others onto adult height loos. We certainly "made do and mended" a great deal of the time and barricaded dangerous areas. The floorboards had to be sanded and a play mat was provided because there were so many splinters. We raised funds by having coffee mornings and sales and applying for grants so that we could provide more equipment, material and toys.

February 2024 – The Village Hall Committee know the Pre-school will continue to thrive and wish them success in their new accommodation at Keinton Mandeville Primary School.

Barton St David History Club

Another well-attended meeting in February enjoyed a fascinating talk by David Odgers on the striking similarities and some differences of the experiences of Glastonbury Abbey and the Rock Churches of Lalibela in Ethiopia, which is (loosely) twinned with Glastonbury.

Over the years there have been several largely unsuccessful attempts to protect the Rock Churches but sadly at present Lalibela is inside a conflict zone and conservation efforts have had to stop.

Lydford and District Gardening Club



Reading this you may well be in a state of shock. Reputedly upstanding and honourable members of the community might have recently been seen in a state of deshabille.

Destroying reputations which have been many years in the building, scantily clad citizens may well have been spotted going towards or returning from their wet and cold vegetable patches, muttering glumly to themselves about the vagaries of the modern climate and the fact that Good Friday cannot be relied upon as was once the case. There is probably a posh word for potato growers. Just as a viticulturist is someone who grows grapes, it surely ought to be the case that those who concentrate on the humble 'spud' should have their own complicated and archaic description.

On-line encyclopaedias are not much use in the quest for this term so in the spirit of Shakespeare, who invented many words to suit his purpose, 'Solanumists' is offered for public consumption. It is relatively common knowledge that there are only two acceptable tests to determine when potatoes should be planted. The first is that they should be put into the ground on the Friday before Easter. As a irrefutable rule this has a major issue. Easter is the original movable feast and, according to one source, can occur at any time between March 22nd and April 25th. Thus Good Friday has a possible range between March 20th and April 23rd. Consequently, solanumists who follow this advice can be planting in the teeth of howling gales, harsh frosts and freezing deluges or they can wait until a few days before the beginning of May and miss out on a month of perfect growing weather.

Therefore we come to the other litmus test for putting King Edwards into the soil. It makes some sort of scientific sense that the ground should be warmish before seed potato 'babies' are deposited 6 inches or thereabouts under the surface. A thermometer, as a means of gauging soil warmth, would be a very blunt instrument, especially when a much more sensitive piece of technology is readily available.

The only true and accurate way of telling whether it is actually the time to plant potatoes is to lower one's trousers and, if worn, undergarments and to sit upon the soil. If the experience provided by bare skin upon growing medium is comfortable then planting can go ahead. If things feel a little chilly then a few more days will have to be spent on a reserve occupation such as creating a model of St. Pancras station from Bryant and May's finest products. Therefore if a neighbour's behaviour appears somewhat shocking at this time of year, relax and appreciate that such an apparently unedifying state of undress is just an unavoidable feature of modern holistic husbandry.

As we career towards another growing season, the grim days of February would appear to be several aeons ago. However, it was on February 13th that Dr. Francis Burroughs came to the Parish Hall to talk to the Club about Historic Front Gardens. He spoke well with some dry humour and concentrated upon the vast expanses that provided the outlook from the front doors of the great stately homes. Structure, form and texture were more important than colour, even though most properties had a large labour force.

Dr. Burroughs offered the Stourhead landscape as a classic example and raised the interesting point that a lot of the effort in past times was not for immediate effect. We are now enjoying the results of earth moved and trees planted several centuries ago. Immediately post-creation, many of the National Trust vistas that we now enjoy would have appeared very raw and distinctly patchy.

Subsequently, on March 12th, Mike from the Gardens Group came to talk about the benefits, real and supposed of the technique known as *'Companion Planting'*. He spoke well, as he always has done, and fought back the urge to base his offering on how we could be persuaded to pass through the doors of Brimsmore Garden Centre and spend lots of money.

Calendula and tagetes were recommended for their ability to counter invasive weeds and deter equally annoying whitefly. Surprisingly he made no mention of soil warmth testing with a companion!

In more recent times, Wheathill's famous residents included Owen Maclaren, designer of the Spitfire undercarriage and later the famous folding Maclaren 'Baby Buggy'.

The Parish Council (PC) met on Wednesday, 13th March, at the Parish Hall. Topics covered included:

- Somerset Councillors' Report A written report was received which explained how Somerset Council had reached a balanced budget for the coming year and confirmed that no decision has yet been made on the future of Dimmer Lane Recycling Centre. The full report can be read on the website.
- **Planning** there were no new planning applications to consider.
- **Local Plan Update** A consultation is now beginning on an update which will deliver 505 new dwellings in the Mendip area over the next 5 years. None will be close to our Parish.
- Flooding A decision was taken not to reimburse local residents for sandbags
 used during recent flood events. Whilst the PC was very sympathetic, it was
 felt that the best use of available funding would be to invest in future flood
 prevention measures. This was a point that had been made by some of the
 affected residents themselves.
- **Local engagement** a questionnaire is being developed to try to improve the PC's presence and support to the local community.
- **PC processes** a useful discussion was held on how to improve the efficiency of future PC meetings.

Next PC meeting

This will be held on Wednesday, 10th April. It will be a short meeting, starting at 18:00hrs, which will cover the proposed PC Budget for the coming year and consider any new planning applications. It will finish in time for *the Annual Parish Meeting to start at 18:30hrs*. This is a meeting at which reports from the PC, its Working Groups and other Community Groups report are received.

All parishioners are encouraged to attend and have the opportunity to contribute throughout the meeting. Free refreshments will be provided.

Flood Risk Management Working Group

Following some serious recent flooding events in Lydford, and advice from the Environment Agency that flooding in our area is likely to become more frequent and less predictable, the Parish Council has established a **'Flood Risk Management Working Group'** to better understand our community's flood risk factors, to identify opportunities to reduce them and to determine how we can best reduce the impact of flooding when it does occur.

200 years of the RNLI

During the early 1820s Sir William Hillary, a Yorkshire man born in 1771 moved to the Isle of Man where he witnessed several shipwrecks. He drew up plans for a lifeboat service crewed by trained people for all the British coast and appealed to the Navy and prominent citizens for the formation of *The National Institution for the Preservation of Lives and Property from Shipwreck*. This fell on deaf ears.

Sir William then rebranded his appeal which gathered momentum and gained the royal patronage of George IV. Thus on 4th March 1824, "Royal" was added to the already lengthy title. Thankfully on 5th October 1854 the name was changed to the Royal National Lifeboat Institution.

This year is our 200th anniversary; since it was founded lifeboat crews and lifeguards have SAVED over 144,000 lives and performed countless rescues, all by volunteers.

The Somerton & Langport Area branch strive to raise money for the RNLI and this year we are hoping to put on some extra events.

We would be most grateful if anyone had some spare time to help with our fundraising for this vital life-saving institution.

New life for all the world



Sowing seeds, chitting potatoes, choosing varieties. Easter acts as starter's orders for the gardening year. Beds are cultivated, lawns mown, plans for all the growth and new life that spring and summer will bring made and then turned into action.

There's a much greater connection between gardening and Easter than it merely being the time to dust off forks and spades.

For in the Bible, a garden is the setting for Easter itself. In John's Gospel (*Jn 20:1-18*) Mary Magdalene meets the risen Jesus in a garden. Indeed, Jesus's appearance to Mary is so unexpected that at first she can't believe it's really him. So she mistakes the man she meets 'supposing him to be the gardener' (John 20:15).

In John's account, all the new life contained in the first Easter chimes with a much earlier story set in a garden too. This is of the new life of another man and woman, the creation story of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden and contained in the book of Genesis (*Genesis 2:4- 3:24*). In that story, Adam is the gardener (*Gen 2:15*), only for things to go wrong. In John, Jesus is portrayed as the new Adam – come to bring new life that has no end.

What would happen if we were to think of our churches as gardens, primed to welcome the spring that is the new life of Jesus this Easter? What would happen if we imagined ourselves called to be gardeners – like our father Adam and the new Adam, Jesus? What would we expect to grow? What might need pruning or weeding? What new plans for the coming season would we make and turn into action? What would be the harvest that we'd sow for, tend and then reap?

For I reckon we should see Easter as the starting point of all that God wants to do among us and with us. Jesus's resurrection opens us to being part of God's new creation. Easter offers us a fresh start for life, relationships and the life of our churches: new life for all the world.



Plotgate Community Farm got the year off to a good start with a lively Community Consultation meeting in January.

Over 50 people filled Barton Village Hall to hear about and consider the farm's future developments including access, community food hub and a new project to remove water pollution and alleviate flooding while regenerating a robust ecosystem on The Mead land to the north of the farm.

Many thanks to Sarah Dyke MP for attending and local residents in particular for the support, participation and useful insights discussed.

If you'd like to help with monitoring water quality, wildlife observation, or physical work such as managing hedgerows and rhynes or scything in the appropriate seasons, do get in touch.

Plotgate Community Farm is co-operatively run by its members. The growers and volunteers produce seasonal vegetables on a 16-acre site in Barton St David. Members can collect, or have delivered, a weekly or fortnightly share of the produce, each box containing at least 8 different types of vegetable. There are events, activities and opportunities as well as fresh food all through the year.
